At the outset, the Principal welcomed the members of the House.

Proceedings of the meeting -

- 1 **Dr. Jasveera Anoop Minhas** started her conversation with multidisciplinary education. She totally supported this view and emphasized that students must be allowed to take admission in offline and online courses both.  
**Prof. Harjinder Pal** and **Prof. Dharampal** were not in favour of this view as this is not feasible on online and offline mode both and infrastructure and time cannot be sufficiently provided.  
**Principal** fully supported this view and like to encourage students to take admission in multidisciplinary courses. It will be beneficial for students as in this credits are involved.

**Resolved**

Whole house has accepted details of points mentioned in agenda item 1 and agreed to to encourage students to take admission in multidisciplinary courses. It will be beneficial for students as in this credits are involved.

- 2 **Dr. Harjinder Singh** supported Principals view. He clearly mentioned that all data is available online. He supported this criteria by giving excellent examples of "Li-ion battery from Aloevera" and "Cactus leather". His views are firmly towards the students interests. Students can join multiple online courses on SWAYAM and MOOCS as their certificates are valid worldwide, it will surely develop good researchers all our the world.  
**Dr. Jasveera Anoop Minhas** also supported this view by mentioning that students must get chance to learn through digital learning platforms. For Harnessing the faculty of institution FDPs on MOOCS must organize in the college campus (i.e. 1 week workshop).  
**Dr. Sanjana Saggi** supported the view to get conducted basic ICT tools FDP.  
**Dr. Jaswinder Singh** also appreciated the idea to organizing 5 days FDP (using ICT Tools and application softwares)  
**Prof. Harjinder Pal** also supported this view but according to him it may create confusion.  
**Prof. Arun Sharma** did not supported this view as according to him non specificity of degree will create problems in PG courses.

**Dr. Parmjit Kaur** strongly supported this viewpoint and emphasised the need and importance of advanced infrastructure i.e. audio-visual studios for recording the lectures with minimum needs such as laptop, computer, camera, white board, microphone (lapel mics, shotgun mic), LED lights (convenient and eco-friendly) with adequate space in the institution for the enhancement of qualitative blended teaching-learning methods.

**Prof. Sheikhar** supported this view and said major and minor subjects could help students in their long run career.

All members supported this view and support FDP and chalk out requirements. We must motivate students to go through MOOCS courses.

**Principal** strongly supported NEP 2020. She support yearly diploma to students. She recommend all the teachers to record minimum 5 lectures in the summer vacations. She has a strong hope for something good out of this practice. She said we are with this policy for students but our perspectives must be clearly defined.

#### **Resolved**

Whole house has accepted details of points mentioned in agenda item 2 and house supported NEP 2020., yearly diploma to students. House also recommend all the teachers to record minimum 5 lectures in the summer vacations. A strong hope for something good out of this practice is expected.

- 3 **Dr. Aruna Rani** supported this and agreed for internships by collaborating with Industries and advised to add industrial courses.
- Dr. Harjinder Singh** advised to map about internships in college.
- Dr. Sanjana Saggi** firmly supported the view on Industry and Institute collaboration.
- Prof. Sheikhar** gives stress on his view that courses for hands on training with machines must be included so that students can be properly equipped with required skills to work for the industries.
- Principal** supported this view and like to take Senior secondary students feedback for their quantitative concern which could help to chalk out our future actions.
- Dr. Kuljinder Kaur** highlighted that Alumni must be registered.
- Principal** supported this view and said that constitution must be formed and Alumni committee will be enlisted soon.
- Prof. Ranjit** has given consolation statement that he will provide a good team on Monday.
- Dr. Harjinder Singh** supported this view. He illuminates that ideas will be created by research committee.
- Prof. Dharampal** discussed about the problems of funds for the research work.
- Dr. Kuljinder Kaur** highlighted that financial supports can be taken from sponsors (NGOs)
- Prof. Sheikhar** further support it by saying only interested members must be added in the Research and Development committee which will also work for the funds for research in the institution.
- Dr. Sanjana Saggi** supported the view that Research and Development cell is necessity of the hour in the institution
- Prof. Ranjit** advised that funds can be collected during organised seminars/conferences as fee from students, researchers and academicians.
- Principal** advised the whole house that Research committees in (PG departments) and policies must be formed. She strongly supported research in the institution. She emphasizes that two National and International seminars must be organized yearly. She had also given stress for the 3 month PG departmental Training course which will promote research.

#### **Resolved**

Whole house has accepted details of points mentioned in agenda item 3 as all members supported this view. All agreed to add new courses of Industrial areas. It was stressed on the view to visit Industries for MOUs signed with them which will surely empowers the exposure of the students towards Industrial section. house also emphasizes that two National and International seminars must be organized yearly and had also given stress for the 3 month PG departmental Training course which will promote research.

- 4 **Dr. Harjinder Singh** mentioned that it is possible to collaborate with foreign Higher education institutions. Faculty training must be done for this task.  
**Principal** clearly said that grants are available for the International lectures. Research and Development committee will motivate and provide training to the staff of the institution.

Whole house has accepted details of points mentioned in agenda item 4 and agreed to both Dr. Harjinder Singh and Principal Madam,s views.

- 5 **Dr. Harjinder Singh** support Local language as it help students to understand better.  
**Prof. Arun Sharma** mentioned that language must be spontaneous according to the situation. It can be English or Punjabi or Can be the hybrid form of both.  
**Principal** mentioned that English and Punjabi clashes always occurred but Punjabi as being local language is flexible and can be moulded according to the situation easily. It must be promoted.

**Dr. Sanjana Saggi**supported the efforts to the promotion of employability and also have given reference of recent guest lecture organised on "Employment Generation Schemes" by the department of Industries and commerce Punjab.  
**Principal** fully supported the promotion of the employability and mentioned that it is already going well in the institution. She also supported the tution work doing by the students of the institution. Job oriented courses must be added.

**Resolved**


House is in favour of these views for promotion of the employability and agreed that it is already going well in the institution.


**Resolved**
